

CORRECT ANSWERS TO THE QUESTIONS ABOUT THE MEDICINE PACKAGE AND PACKAGE LEAFLET

1. What is the name of the medicine, and what is its active substance?

- The name of the medicine is Sneezix (invented name), and active substance is cetirizine.

2. What is the strength of the medicine, and what is its pharmaceutical form (e.g. ointment, capsule)?

- The pharmaceutical form of the medicine is tablet, and its strength is 10 mg, i.e., one tablet contains 10 mg of cetirizine.

3. When does the medicine expire, when can you no longer use it?

- The medicine bears the marking "EXP 12/2019, which means that the medicine expires in January 2020. The last month the medicine can be used is thus December 2019, and after that the medicine may no longer be used.

4. For what kinds of purposes can you use the medicine?

- For the treatment and prevention of allergic symptoms. These symptoms include allergic rhinitis, allergic eye symptoms, and allergic urticaria.

5. Who may not use the medicine?

- The medicine may not be used if you are allergic to cetirizine, substances related to cetirizine or other ingredients of the medicine, or if you have severe renal insufficiency. You must consult your doctor about using the medicine if you have renal insufficiency, epilepsy or a predisposition to convulsions. Additionally, you must not take cetirizine for three days before an allergy test.

6. How much of the medicine can an adult take?

- The medicine dosage for adults is 1 tablet a day.

7. Children of what age can use the medicine, and how much of it can they take?

- The medicine may be used by children of 6 years of age and older. Children 6-12 years of age may take 1/2 tablet 1-2 times a day. Children over 12 years of age can use the adult dosage, or 1 tablet a day. There are different forms of the product for children under 6 years of age.

8. How is the medicine taken?

- The medicine is taken with plenty of fluid, which means around a glass of water.

9. Can the medicine have adverse effects?

- The medicine can have adverse effects, just like all medicines. Common adverse reactions are drowsiness or exhaustion, dizziness or headache, and diarrhoea, nausea, and dry mouth. Uncommon adverse reactions include restlessness, stomachache, and weakness. Rare adverse reactions include low spirits or sleeplessness, convulsions, rapid heartbeat, and swelling.

10. How is the medicine stored?

- The medicine is stored at a temperature under +30 degrees. The medicine must also be stored in a place where children cannot get to the medicine or see it.
